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FOREWORD



This volume of Revolutionary Soldiers buried in Indiana is presented with the hope that it will materially assist in increasing the membership in D. A. R. Chapters in the State. Within these pages will be found authentic service for 1394 soldiers and patriots. The compilation of these records has been the project of Indiana Daughters for the past four years, during the administrations of Miss Bonnie Farwell and Mrs. William H. Schlosser, Indiana State Regents.

This volume is not the work of one person, but the work of many. Chapter members have read all the D. A. R. Lineage volumes, Probate Court Records, Wills, Deeds, and Marriage Records, prior to the date 1850; also early newspapers of the counties and County Histories. Cemeteries have been searched for the graves.

Many persons, not D. A. R.'s, have contributed records of their ancestors. The Indiana State Library, through Dr. C. B. Coleman, State Librarian and Miss Anna Poucher, Librarian Genealogy Section, have furnished much valuable help. Mrs. Harvey Morris, Genealogist, Salem, Indiana, has assisted in several genealogical tangles and has supplied further data. The Indiana S. A. R. turned over their records. Members of the Indiana Historical Society have been helpful in counties where there are no D. A. R. Chapters. The assistance given has been praise-worthy and much appreciated, and is hereby gratefully acknowledged.

All of the names on the Indiana Pension Rolls have been traced and service secured for those who remained in the State. When the date of death and location of grave has not been obtained, that soldier has been placed in the county from which he applied for a pension. In some instances the date of last payment of pension has been secured and this is stated to show the approximate death date.

Information is given for 31 men, whose services are indefinite. With further research these may prove revolutionary services.

When the grave has been reported as marked by a family monument, this is indicated by the use of the word "stone", in the record. If the grave is otherwise marked, that is so stated. Individuals and chapters are given credit for the material they collected. If no name or chapter name is given, then that soldier's record has been secured by the editor of this volume.

Because of the variations in the different lists of the men who were in Col. Archibald Lochry's Company, when he with 36 others

were massacred by the Indians, on Aug. 24, 1781, in what is now Dearborn County, Indiana, the entire list is given. This list is a copy of the original which is to be found in the British Museum. A few of the surnames have been supplied.

We do not claim that this volume contains all the Revolutionary soldiers and patriots buried in Indiana. We hope, however, that the publication of this number will bring forth not only additional data on these, but also on soldiers not listed.
